# Solemníty of Pentecost

The Easter Season ends with the Feast of Pentecost. The Apostles are empowered by the Holy Spirit to go out and spread the Good News. This same Holy Spirit is given to the whole Church, even to this day, and we too are given the gifts of the Holy Spirit to continue the mission of Jesus. Pentecost is considered the Birthday of the Church, the Body of Christ, and the Spirit is still building up that Body to this day. Let us pray for a renewal of the gifts of the Spirit within each of us so that the whole Church can be enlivened and renewed:

# "Come Holy Spirit, Fill the hearts of the Faithful, And renew in them the Fire of Your Love"

As the Easter Season ends today, the Paschal Candle is extinguished at the end of Mass and is placed near the Baptismal Font. Throughout the year, the Paschal Candle is used during Baptisms and at Funerals to remind us that the light of Faith, received in Baptism, has been with the person throughout their faith life and will lead them into the glory of the Kingdom. The double Easter Alleluia is used today for the dismissal of the Mass:

"Go in Peace, Alleluia, Alleluia! Thanks be to God, Alleluia, Alleluia!"
