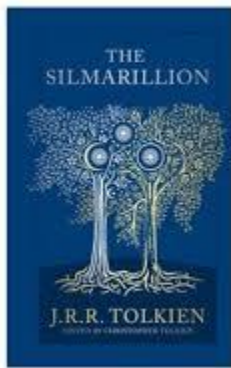


WORLD MISSION SUNDAY OCTOBER 19

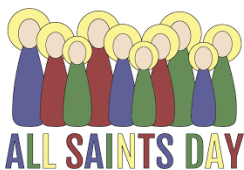
